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CULINARY ARTS BUILDING

The new Culinary Arts Building will provide a state-of-the-art facility, meeting the educational mission of the Culinary Arts and Professional Baking programs at Los Angeles Trade-Technical College.

The two-story, 71,102 square-foot steel braced-frame structure has an exterior finish of insulated metal panels and glazed aluminum curtain walls. The interior allows for a seamless transition between laboratory and general classroom settings and a living lab where students learn in a real-life dining setting. The project also includes a loading dock, a stand-alone restroom facility, utility yard, and an artificial turf activity field. The field will be used by students and community for physical activity, while the campus will use it for gatherings and special events, such as graduation. Lastly, the new building includes an herb garden, roof-top solar power panels, an outdoor dining area, and plaza.

LATTC's Culinary Arts Program is the oldest, continuous culinary program based at a college in the nation. The Culinary Arts and Baking Department serves 800 students each year and is accredited by the American Culinary Federation Education Foundation Accrediting Commission (ACFEFAC). The program has an articulation agreement with California State Polytechnic University for transfer students and offers an Associate in Arts degree in Culinary Arts or Professional Baking.
